The menu will be BBQ, salads and bread. Please be on the lookout for details about days, times and locations.

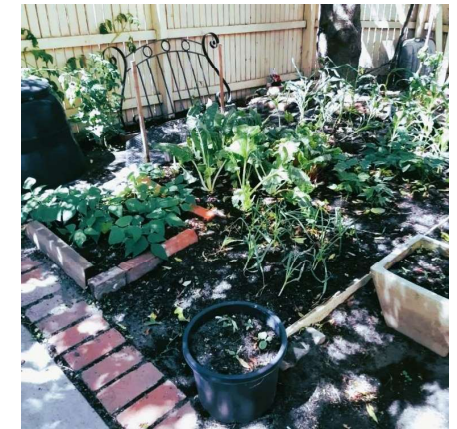
